We are delighted that our Early Years Centre was graded as **good** in all areas of with Inspectors clearly stating that:

Staff have high expectations for all children, and their needs and interests are a priority. Children are encouraged to follow routines and join in with group activities when they are ready to do so.

Children are happy and thrive in this caring and nurturing setting. They develop strong bonds with their key person and make positive relationships with their friends. Children take part in activities that teach them new skills.

Children experience communication-rich mealtimes. They chat to their friends and staff members as they slice their fruit at snack time. Children explore a variety of tastes and textures and comment on their likes and dislikes.

Children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) are supported by a caring team and receive additional support at appropriate times.

Managers have a strong ambition for the setting. Since the last inspection, they have worked particularly hard on developing partnerships with parents. Partnerships with parents are very strong.

The School Day

The doors open at 8:40 am when children can enter the school.

Morning Reception, Key Stage 1 and 2 8:45 am – 12:15 pm

Nursery 8:45 am - 11:45 am

Afternoon Reception, Key Stage 1 and 2 1:10 pm - 3:15 pm

Nursery 12:30 pm - 3:30 pm

Early Years and Key Stage 1 children receive a morning and an afternoon break.

Early Years and Key Stage 1 children receive a piece of fruit every day.

There is a tuck shop available at morning break for KS1/2 children (preordered on Pay360).

Children may bring in a water bottle containing water (not squash or fizzy pop).

Breaks and Meals

School meals are £2.30 per day - £11.50 per week (this is subject to change)

Under the Universal Free School Meals Programme, all Reception and KS1 children are entitled to a receive a free piece of fruit at breaktime and a free hot school meal at lunchtime.

Please complete the Early Years Pupil Premium Registration Form as you may also be eligible for this (which would give your child milk and KS2 school meals at no cost.)

School Milk is 32p per day (subject to change) payable from the day after the child's 5th birthday.

School Fund is £15.00 per year for Nursery and Reception and £6.00 per year thereafter.

Online Payment System

Within school we use an online payment system.

Once your child has started in September you will be issued with account set up details .

The online payment system can be used to purchase the following:

Items ordered online will be taken to your child's classroom the following day and a confirmation text sent to parents.

The payment is also used to:

- Select appointment times for Parents Evenings
- Select extra-curricular activities (Year 1 upwards)

School Uniform

- Winter October (after half term) to April (Easter) but can be worn all year
- Navy cardigan or jumper
- Sky blue shirt or blouse with tie
- Plain grey skirt, pinafore or tailored trousers
- Navy, sky blue and gold striped tie (elasticated up to Year 3)
- Plain and flat black school shoes
- Plain black, white, navy or grey tights or socks.
- Summer-April (after Easter) to October (half term) only
- Sky blue polo shirt with grey skirt, trousers or shorts
- Plain grey skirt, pinafore or tailored shorts
- Knee length pale blue and white striped or gingham summer dress
- Sandals may be worn in dry weather with socks. Sandals must be black or navy and flat

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- The P.E. uniform is a white T shirt and navy shorts/skirt and plain black pumps (not branded)
- A costume (trunks or full costume) and a towel are required for when children start swimming
- All pupils must wear a swimming hat and swimming goggles are not allowed for safety reasons
- For outdoor P.E. a pair of plain training shoes or pumps, a navy sweatshirt and a pair of navy joggers are optional
