

### **Curriculum Information**

Year 1 Autumn Term 1 2023

Subject	What are we learning?	How you can help at home
English	In English we are studying 'This is the Bear and the Scary Night' and 'Wiffy Wilson - The wolf who wouldn't go to school. We will be writing for different purposes, including writing a set of instructions for getting ready for school. We will be focusing on hearing and writing the initial, final and medial sounds in words. Whilst writing, we will identify what phonemes we can hear and then use an alphabet card to help us to write the corresponding grapheme. We will begin to use finger spaces and full stops in our writing. <b>Reading books will be changed each week</b> .	ReadingPlease hear your child read at home at least five times a week. Askquestions which encourage your child to draw inferences aboutcharacters' feelings, thoughts, emotions and actions. Please helpyour child to read every night and record on the GoRead App.Bedtime reading advice is available at www.theschoolrun.comSpellingPlease help your child practise their spellings several times a week.Regular practise at home makes such a difference.Online LearningPlease encourage your child to explore Oxford Reading Buddy,Purple Mash and Education City throughout the week too.
Phonics	This half term we will be recapping the sounds previously taught in Reception and moving on to learn some new digraphs. We will be practising segmenting and blending the sounds in real and alien words.	Each week homework will be set based on the phonemes that the children have learnt during phonics lessons. Please encourage your children to practise these phonemes at home.
Maths	We will begin the half term by focusing on number and place value. We will be identifying the number that is one more/less than a given number. We will also be using different strategies to count sets of objects. We will move on to focusing on addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Pupils will be familiarising themselves with the vocabulary and symbols involved with the mathematical operations. Children will practically use objects to solve simple calculations.	You can help your child by practising reading and writing numbers to 100. Please help your child to practise their 2 and 10 timetables preparation for their weekly challenge. <u>Online Learning</u> Your child can develop their mathematical skills using Education City and Purple Mash. Science	In Science we will be learning about seasonal changes. We will be naming the 4 seasons and looking at the typical weather types and events for each season. We will be using simple equipment to observe the weather and record our findings using tables and charts. We will also be finding out night and day and recognising that the seasons have varying day lengths in the UK>.	You could help your child by looking out for different signs that the seasons are changing. Discuss what they can see around them. History	Our topic this half term is 'School days'. We will be looking at the history of our school and then looking back to what school life was like during the Victorian era. We will be experiencing what a Victorian classroom would have been like. We will be learning about the work of Samuel Wilderspin, who made great changes to school life.	You could help your child by helping them to research what school life was like during the Victorian era. Discuss with them what similarities and differences there are between life in Victorian times and our lives now. Which era would they prefer to live in?
Geography	As part of our topic 'School days', during our Geography lessons, we will be working on fieldwork skills and exploring our school environment. We will be looking closely at the different areas within our school and how they are used. We will also be identifying areas where litter can be a problem and coming up with ideas to reduce litter in our school environment. Moving on from this we will be looking at how to recycle to reduce waste.	<u>Online Learning</u> : You can help your child by using Google Earth using the following link - <u>Google Earth</u> Have a look at your local area. What human and physical features can your child see?
Art & Design	As part of our 'Mix it' topic. We will be learning about colour mixing. We will be learning about primary and secondary colours and about what two colours are used to mix the secondary colours. We will present our findings in the form of a colour wheel. We will move on to using our knowledge of colour mixing to create colourful pieces of artwork.	You can support your child at home by letting them explore colour mixing using paints. Can you child predict what will happen when they add two colours together. Ask your child to share their knowledge of primary and secondary colours.

Computing	This half term we will be looking at how to use technology safely and respectfully. We will be focusing on how to keep personal information private and what they should do if they have concerns about content and contact whilst using the internet.	You can help your child at home by discussing with them about online safety and what they should do if something they see whilst on the internet makes them feel uncomfortable.
PE	This half term, during indoor PE we will be focusing on Dance. We will be moving to different pieces of music in a range of ways. During outdoor games, we will be focusing on playing team games. We will be developing our skills when working as part of a team. <u>PE days</u> Indoor PE - Thursday Outdoor Games - Friday	<ul> <li>You can help your child by encouraging them to get dressed and undressed independently. Swimming	This term will be an introduction to swimming for the year 1 children. There will be no swimming, lessons will all be dry side, this will allow children to get used to the teachers, pool environment, changing areas, equipment and pool rules. This will create a more confident swimmer for next term when year 1 will begin their swimming journey.
