Year 4 Summer Term 2 2025

Subject	What are we learning?	How you can help at home
English	<p>In English, the children will be looking at several different texts and looking at different genres of writing including diary entries, postcards, narrative and report writing. They will be learning how to vary the lengths of sentences and use a range of different sentence starters.</p> <p><b>Spelling Tests will take place on a Friday.</b> <b>English homework is given out on a Friday and is due in the following Friday.</b></p>	<p><u>Reading</u> Please hear your child read at home at least three times a week. Discuss, and help your child to find, the meanings of any unfamiliar words. Ask your child to summarise what they have read or to recap the story so far. Please help your child to read every night and record on the Boom Reader App. Bedtime reading advice available at <a href="http://www.theschoolrun.com">www.theschoolrun.com</a></p> <p><u>Spelling</u> Please help your child practise their spellings several times a week. Regular practice at home makes such a difference. Encourage the use of a dictionary to find definitions of new vocabulary.</p> <p><u>Online learning</u> Please encourage your child to explore reading activities on Oxford Reading Buddy, Purple Mash and Education City throughout the week too. Children can access the Immersive reader/dictate tools on OneNote to support with Reading and Writing.</p>
Phonics	<p>For those children still having Phonics sessions, these will be daily and focus on their individual Phonics phase. Children will be segmenting and blending sounds and encouraged to spell them correctly.</p>	<p>Please hear your child read at home at least three times a week. Encourage children to segment and blend sounds when reading and practise spelling the words they are given on a weekly basis.</p>

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<b>Maths</b>	<p>In Maths this half term, we will be continuing our work on fractions greater than one then focusing on symmetry and time. The children will look at creating shapes in a mirror line, as well as reading, writing and converting time between analogue and digital and solving problems.</p> <p>Children will be applying their skills of mental and formal addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division to a range of one and two-step problems in arithmetic.</p> <p><b>Children will have timetable activities three times a week in lessons – this will include a test.</b></p> <p><b>Please ensure your child accesses TT Rockstars at home. <b>PE</b>	<p>Children will be taught the key skills for Basketball during indoor PE this half term, where they will learn different pass techniques, ball control and shots at the net.</p> <p>In outdoor PE, the children will be taught key skills for Athletics developing coordination skills and sportsmanship.</p> <p>The children will demonstrate a broader range of throwing, running and jumping techniques, in isolation or combination, with improving accuracy and competence and compete in a team games.
